## Children recovered by AAFLC

American Association For Lost Children (AAFLC) has successfully found and recovered kidnapped 5-year-old Ivory "Junior" Harris and 3-year-old Natalya "Talya" Harris, who were abducted by their non-custodial father, Ivory Harris Sr., on July 23 from Albany, N.Y., and found Monday, Sept. 22, in Cutler Bay, Fla.

At approximately 10:10 p.m. Eastern Time, Monday, AAFLC Investigators, working in collaboration with Miami-Dade Cutler Ridge law enforcement, recovered the two kidnapped children at the home of Kenneth Harris of 22644 SW 109 Path, Cutler Bay, where abductor Ivory Harris and the kidnapped children were living.

Miami-Dade Police Cutler Ridge law enforcement assisted custodial mother, Nicole Gantt, to the home of Kenneth Harris in a break-away encounter that included six police officers surrounding the home to recover the kidnapped children. Upon entering home, a police officer found one child in the home and the other child was with Ivory Harris and an uncle at McDonald's. Officers awaited the return of Ivory Harris with second child at residence; one officer waited inside the home to make sure the abductor would not be tipped off. Upon return to the home, Ivory Harris was quickly apprehended by Miami-Dade Police law enforcement who recovered the second child. The children are now safely in the custody of their mother, Nicole Gantt, of Albany.

AAFLC's Investigative Team included St. Vincent College senior Matt Dunlap and an AAFLC rescued child family, Nabila and Michael Henry, who current reside in Florida. Nabila Henry's own daughter and son were found and recovered by AAFLC in Tripoli, Lebanon, in October 1996.
